

ENTRIES: All entries to be submitted on Comps Online website (link below) https://www.comps-online.com.au

- Please ensure that you have read the conditions of entry and the code of conduct and agreed to them. You will not be able to finalise your entry until this is done.
- Please complete all your section entries in one application (eg. piano, vocal, orchestral all on one entry). There is a \$4.50 administration fee payable per entry application transaction.
- Payment must be made at the time of completing the entry.
- Entries are not valid and will not be processed until payment has been received. Payment will be by PayPal or Credit Card.

STRICTLY NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED THIS YEAR Please appreciate the amount of work that is required to enter manual entries on mass.



- Each genre a student competes in incurs a cost of \$2.50, eg. students enters both solo flute and solo voice, the total cost incurred would be \$5.
- If a backing track was transposed into an alternate key for performance, it is preferable that the sheet music be submitted in performance key (not original). Chord charts with lyrics are also acceptable for any NON-CLASSICAL own choice music submissions.

Conditions

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Competition is only open to amateurs who are 19 years of age or under. The term "amateur" means one whose principal source of income is not derived from the exercise of his or her talent in the particular class for which he or she may have entered. This condition does not apply to conductors or accompanists.
- 2. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the full fee. The Bundaberg Eisteddfod Executive Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 3. All accompaniments must be performed as per specific section requirements.
- 4. Ensembles only piano accompaniments for C Grade String Sections may be played by a teacher. All other sections piano accompaniments must be played by a student.
- 5. Competitors and accompanists must be present at the time specified for the item in which they are competing and assemble at the place specified by the chairperson of sessions.
- 6. Competitors will compete in the order as shown in the program unless instructed otherwise by the chairperson of sessions.
- 7. The Bundaberg Eisteddfod Executive Committee reserves the right to amend the printed program should it be considered necessary.
- 8 All own choice music (PDF's and backing tracks) must be electronically uploaded. In the event of non-submission, the competitor will not be eligible for a prize.
- 9. No parent, teacher, conductor or competitor may address the adjudicator before or during a session.
- 10. No parent shall be allowed on the performing area, except as accompanist or conductor.
- 11. The adjudicator's decision shall be final, except if it subsequently transpires that some error in identity has taken place, then the committee shall have the power to decide.
- 12. Protests must be lodged in writing to the secretary within 30 minutes of the cause of such protest arising, accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 which will be forfeited if the protest be deemed frivolous. The decision of the Bundaberg Eisteddfod Executive Committee is final.
- 13. No prize will be awarded where the Adjudicator considers merit insufficient.
- 14. All competitors will receive an adjudication sheet.
- 15. Choral competition in the respective classes is open to any body of unpaid singers and performers.
- 16. Competitors must perform within the section as schedule in the program.
- 17. Competitors in the Bundaberg Eisteddfod, will perform:
- (a) From an original published edition of the sheet music: or
- (b) From a photocopy, transcription or arrangement of sheet music that is accompanied by a letter from the music publisher authorizing the use of this photocopy, transcription or arrangement: or
- (c) From sheet music where both the work and edition are out of copyright* or
- (d) By ear.
- *Composer/lyricist/arranger ALL died before 1953 and the edition publication date was more than 25 years ago.
- 18. The Bundaberg Eisteddfod Executive Committee will not be liable for any copyright infringements relating to the use of photocopies should they occur.
- 19. The Bundaberg Eisteddfod Executive Committee reserves the right to combine or split sections based on entries.
- 20. Competitors may only perform a piece once throughout this competition.
- 21. For ensemble sections percussion will be supplied as per the stage layouts provided. Percussion must not be moved from the specified area or stated position. We strongly recommend that your students rehearse in this format.
- 22. For all rock bands all members must be finalised at the time of entry.





- Competitors prepare a spoken monologue/dramatic extract which then moves into their chosen musical theatre song. The monologue/dramatic extract can be from the original published musical theatre work or devised by the competitor. Both the spoken text and the songs should develop character, setting and story.
- The monologue/dramatic extract can be self written or created using dialogue from the original published script or libretto.
- The song must be taken from a published musical theatre show.
- The song will be a backing track ONLY. No live accompaniment. No Microphones.
- Both copies of the lyrics of the song and monologue are required for the adjudicator.
- Costume and props are allowed and encouraged but be aware that this is included in your total performance time.
- Both spoken extract and song should not exceed the maximum performance time.


Percussion Stage Layout - Concert Band & Orchestra






















